2024-2025 FBLA ARIZONA – INTRA-CURRICULAR PROGRAM MEMBERSHIP

What is the Intra-Curricular Program Membership Plan?

The Intra-Curricular Program Membership Plan allows students who are enrolled in a Business, Media, and/or Information Technology program to be eligible for the benefits and opportunities of FBLA as a part of the total program delivery. This plan also focuses on the development of essential employability, participative and attitude development skills as called for in the U.S. Department of Labor's Secretary's Commission on Achieving Necessary Skills (SCANS) Report.

Under the Intra-Curricular Program Plan, all students are FBLA members. All students in the local Business Education, Media, and/or Information Technology programs are simply signed up using a fee schedule according to membership numbers.

How Does the Intra-Curricular Program Plan Work?

For a flat fee in a single Business Education, Media, and/or Information Technology program, join FBLA Arizona under a tiered program fee based on student enrollment in your current classes. Reminder all membership payments need to be mailed to the FBLA Arizona Payment Address NOT the National Office:

How is pricing calculated for Intra-Curricular Membership?

Pricing is based on the Business, Media and/or Information Technology program enrollment submitted by your school for the current year. Enrollment numbers are determined by what your school submitted to the Arizona Department of Education/CTE Division. All schools fit within one of the following categories. Schools that have a limited number of students, please contact the State Office for pricing.

• Submitting your Membership. You will submit your membership on the National website. Ignore the invoice as you will be invoiced by the State Office. If your school has multiple chapters, you will need to register them with Nationals SEPARATELY; however, with the state you can have the option to be added as one chapter for enrollment pricing. You will need to let the state know how you would like your membership billed. This will be an added question to your Program of Work.

How do I Register my Students for FBLA Membership?

- ♦ Go to FBLA.org and then click on FBLA Connect Login.
- ◆ Login using your email and password you have created. **IF** you do not remember your password, click on the Forgot your password and the button to reset your password. If you still can't get in, contact the state office.
- Go to the Members Tab and input members.
- ♦ Choose send check later option.
- ♦ Once you hit submit, you will receive an invoice in your email. This invoice will be for the National Fee only; so, ignore it and wait for an invoice from the State.
- Only pay the State Invoice NOT the National Invoice.

Please Note: Click on the steps to verify correct information is provided for school and adviser.

FBLA ARIZONA CHAPTER AWARDS

Each FBLA Chapter is required to reach the Bronze Chapter Award. This program is designed to provide recognition for our Chapters while ensuring that our membership is strong and active. All documentation for awards will be due on **March 10**. Go to azfbla.org website, under **Adviser Resources**.

Arizona Bronze Chapter (Required for all chapters)

- 1. Local Bylaws on record with State Office.
- 2. Minimum membership requirements (currently five paid members).
- 3. Submit Program of Work (POW) to State Office.
- 4. Hold at least four meetings per school year (submit minutes).

Bronze level chapters will receive an official certificate, bronze chapter ribbons at SLC, and chapter listed on the FBLA Arizona website and app.

<u>Arizona Silver Chapter (Bronze level plus the activities below)</u>

- 1. Attend at least two FBLA Arizona events.
- 2. Conduct a Chapter Community Service Project.
- 3. Invite a business and industry person to be a guest speaker in your class.

Silver level chapters will receive an official certificate, silver chapter ribbons at SLC, and chapter name listed on the FBLA Arizona website and app.

Arizona Gold Chapter (Silver level plus the activities below)

- 1. Recruit a school administrator to attend a local or state FBLA event.
- 2. Have at least 10% of your students achieve a Business Achievement Award or LEAD Award. Each level will count as one student.
- 3. Create a chapter budget for the year.
- 4. Complete **ONE** of the following national FBLA chapter awards:
 - a. One level of the Champion Chapter Award (Summer Starter, Shaping Success, Service Season, and CTE Celebration). ML get the MERIT.
 - b. Connect Ten (Increase membership by ten members from previous year)
 - c. Outstanding Local Chapter
 - d. Celebrate FBLA week in February

Gold level chapters will receive an official certificate, gold chapter ribbons at SLC, chapter name listed on the FBLA Arizona website and app, on stage plaque presentation at SLC, and upfront seating at the closing session.

<u>Arizona Platinum Chapter (Gold level plus the activities below)</u>

- 1. Recruit a judge to judge at regional or state competition **OR** a workshop presenter for either the Fall or State Conference.
- 2. Have at least 25% of your students achieve a Business Achievement Award or LEAD Award. Each level will count as one student

FBLA ARIZONA CHAPTER AWARDS

- 3. Compete in ONE of the chapter events at state:
 - a. American Enterprise Report
 - b. Local Annual Chapter Activities Report (MS)
 - c. Local Annual Chapter Report
 - d. Community Service Report
 - e. Partnership with Business Report
 - f. Business Financial Plan
 - g. Business Plan
 - 4. Do one of the following activities:
 - h. Have at least one student apply for an Arizona FBLA state council
 - i. Recruit at least three members for our FBLA Alumni database system
 - j. Have at least one senior apply for the FBLA Arizona Scholarship or the National FBLA scholarship
 - 5. Chapter participates in the State Community Service Project donating to the charity for that year or Chapter contributes \$100 to the FBLA Arizona Scholarship or Sponsorship Fund. The chapter will sponsor and present the winners for one objective test event at State Leadership Conference (This is good for first, second and third place winners in an event). Platinum level chapters will receive an official certificate, platinum chapter ribbons at SLC, chapter listed on the FBLA Arizona website and app, a stage platinum level banner presentation on stage at SLC, an entry as a Gold Seal Chapter at the National level, and upfront seating at the opening and closing session for SLC.











LEAD AWARDS

The LEAD Awards are an individual achievement award program for FBLA-Middle Level members. Participating members have the opportunity to enhance their leadership skills, expand their business knowledge, contribute to their local communities, and earn recognition by immersing themselves in their school and communities. There are two levels to the LEAD Award.

- LEAD Explore Award Members are introduced to the foundations of FBLA, learn how to best take advantage of the opportunities available to them, and develop their leadership skills.
- LEAD Aspire Award Members have the opportunity to select a business skill or content area
 that they would like to further develop. Once they complete a given program within the Aspire
 level, members have the choice of selecting a new business skill or concept to earn an additional
 award.

The LEAD Explore Award is the starting place for FBLA-ML members. Participants will be introduced to FBLA and learn key leadership skills necessary for successful futures.

MERIT AWARD



Chapters work toward building a basic program of work through a calendar of activities to complete throughout the year. Recognition will be given at the Middle School and High School National Leadership Conference to the top 10 states and top 10 local chapters based on the number of point accumulated and quality of entries.

- 1. Please download and review the Merit Award tracker on the National Website.
- 2. Be sure to save your documentation for the activities that you choose to participate in on a shared drive, flash drive, or a folder your hard drive as you complete each activity.
- 3. Once you have completed all your activities, please complete the submission form and upload your documentation.
- 4. Submission forms are now live, but local advisers will not receive log in instructions for FBLA Connect until August 15, as forms are directly tied to each local chapter record.
- 5. Only local chapter advisers or chapter presidents will be able to access and submit entry forms.
- 6. Each entry should only be submitted once.

2024 ONLINE TESTING TOURNAMENT

FBLA Arizona is excited to launch the 11th Annual Online Testing Tournament! This exciting opportunity allows FBLA members to test their knowledge, experience a collection of online tests and compete against other members in the state.

Who:

All Chapters and members are encouraged and invited to participate. The Online Testing Tournament is free for all members! You must be registered with Nationals in order to compete.

What:

The FBLA Online Testing Tournament encompasses some awesome opportunities.

First, it's online testing. During the two-month tournament, students have the opportunity to take as many online tests as they would like. However, you can only take the same test once.

Second, it is a Chapter competition! The top three Chapters from each region will be recognized on stage at their respective Regional Conference. Additionally, the top three statewide Chapters will be recognized on stage at the State Leadership Conference in April. Top Chapters will be determined based on the point system below.

1 st Place	5 points
2 nd Place	4 points
3 rd Place	3 points
4 th Place	2 points
5 th Place	1 point

Where:

Online! For the Online Testing Tournament, the only requirement is that tests be taken in your school environment. We will follow the same proctor rules that we do for the State Leadership Conference. The adviser must complete the *Online Testing Proctor Certification* for each testing date. Failure to do so will result in disqualification. They may not be completed at home. All competitors will be required to fill out and submit an *Honor Code Form* BEFORE they take any tests. The *Honor Code Form* will verify that they have read and will abide by the 2024 Online Testing Tournament Guidelines. If the honor code form is not submitted with each test, the test will not count and your score will be disqualified.

Testing:

During the Online Testing Tournament, every test is taken as an individual – there are no collaborative or team events. After the tournament, your adviser will receive your scores so that you determine which events you would like to compete in at the Regional and State Conferences.

When:

Registration will be accepted during the entire tournament. Testing will be open from 7:00 a.m. – 5:00 p.m. unless otherwise requested. The tournament will be open from October 1 to December 2, 2024.

Middle Level Tests:

Business Etiquette, Business Financial Math & Literacy, Career Exploration, Exploring Business, Digital Citizenship, Digital Photography, Introduction to Business Communication, Introduction to Computer Science & Coding, and Study Skills.

DRESS CODE

Projecting a professional image is vital for business leaders to demonstrate respect for clients, colleagues, and others. This policy is to provide guidance for conference attendees—students, advisers, and guests. Professional business attire is required at all general sessions, competitive events, exhibits, regional meetings, workshops, and other activities unless otherwise indicated in conference materials.

Conference name badges are considered part of the dress code and must be worn at all conference functions. For safety reasons, do not wear conference badges outside of the conference area. The dress code is gender neutral.



ACCEPTABLE ITEMS

BUSINESS PROFESSIONAL

Business Suit

- Suit pants and jacket
- Blouse (or) collared dress shirt
- Neckwear such as tie or scarf
- Dress shoes (or) dress boots

Blazer

- Dress pants, including khakis, (or) dress (or) skirt
- Blazer
- Blouse (or) collared dress shirt
- Neckwear such as tie or scarf
- Dress shoes (or) dress boots

Dress

- A business dress
- Dress shoes (or) dress boots

Other Professional

- Dress pants, including khakis, (or) skirt
- Blouse (or) collared dress shirt
- Neckwear such as tie or scarf
- Dress shoes (or) dress boots

BUSINESS CASUAL

- Dress pants, skirt, (or) khakis/chino-style pants
- Blouse, collared dress shirt, (or) polo shirt
- Dress shoes (or) dress boots

NOTE: Business Casual is only permitted during sessions specifically noted in conference materials.

UNACCEPTABLE ITEMS

The following items are prohibited in all conference areas, including competitive events.



- Denim or flannel clothing
- Shorts
- Athletic clothing
- Leggings or graphically designed hosiery/tights
- Skintight or revealing clothing, including tank tops, spaghetti straps, and mini/short skirts or dresses more than 1" above the knee
- Swimwear
- Flip flops or casual sandals
- Athletic shoes
- Industrial work shoes
- Hiking boots
- Hats
- Graphically printed clothing

No dress code can cover all contingencies, so FBLA members must use a certain amount of judgment in their choice of clothing to wear. Members who experience uncertainty about unacceptable attire should ask their local adviser, state leader, or conference staff.

FBLA recognizes that exceptions may need to be made and will work with advisers on a case-by-case basis to accommodate requests.

Advisers should indicate the need for exceptions on the special accommodation portion of the registration form. Requests made after registration closes must be made in writing.
