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STATE COMPETITION

REGISTRATION IS OPEN

State Leadership Conference (SLC) registration is open. The registration link is: <u>HS registration link</u> and <u>MS registration link</u>. Instructions on how to register are <u>here</u>. Registration will remain open until March 6 at 11:59 p.m. Please make sure your students are registered FBLA members in FBLA Connect by March 1 so they can compete. Also, all payments for hotel, registration, and meals will be made to FBLA Arizona and need to be received by April 1st when you come to the registration table. You can bring a check with you to registration or put it in the mail by March 18, 2025. Please mail to: FBLA Financial Services, PO Box 1440, Owasso, OK 74055.

All-Inclusive cost for the conference is as follows:

All-Inclusive High School Member - \$202 includes registration, t-shirt, and 5 meals All-Inclusive Middle School Member - \$127 includes registration, t-shirt, and 3 meals All-Inclusive High School Adviser - \$157 includes registration, t-shirt, and 5 meals All-Inclusive Middle School Adviser - \$102 includes registration, t-shirt, and 5 meals All-Inclusive High School Chaperone/Guest - \$122 includes registration, t-shirt, and 5 meals All-Inclusive Middle School Chapereon/Guest - \$77 includes registration, t-shirt, and 3 meals

Meals will be at the Tucson Convention Center and can be purchased seperately. Costs are as follows:

Breakfast ONLY (4/2 Both) and (4/3 HS) \$20.00 per meal per day Lunch ONLY (4/1 MS) and (4/2 HS) \$22.00 per meal per day Dinner ONLY (4/1 Both) and (4/2 HS) \$25.00 per meal per day

Hotel Block

If your hotel requires a parking fee, please make sure you select parking and how many nights you need it for and how many busses or vans you are bringing. All attendees MUST stay in our hotel block.

Competitive Events

As your students prepare for State Leadership Conference (SLC), please make sure they are looking over the event guidelines, rating sheets (rubrics), and the national topics. If they competed in these events at regional competition, make sure they are reading over the judge comments and scores they received.

Due to the number of competitors at SLC, some of the ways we do competition are different from how we did them at regional competition. Please read below to see how these events are done for State.

Objective Tests

All objective tests will be done prior to the conference at the school site. These tests will need to be proctored by someone at your school to make sure students are only using one testing device, are staying only on the testing page, and are not using anyone or anything to help them take these tests. It is very important these tests are closely monitored. If a student moves away from the main testing screen more than one time, they will be disqualified from the event. The testing system will be open from February 24 to March 28. Please make sure your students are testing in that time frame. For those doing computer applications, database analysis, spreadsheet applications, or word processing, objective tests MUST be done by March 5 as only the top 15 or the top 10% of competitors in that event will move onto the production portion of the test which will be done at the State Leadership Conference.

Students can take up to three objective tests at SLC. These tests are to be done individually and no other help should be given to them.

Role Play and Skill Event Tests

Testing needs to be done for both the role play and skill event competitions.

For the role play events, teams will take the test individually and all teammates scores will be averaged to get a final score. The multiple choice test scores will be added to the performance score in determining our winners. These tests must be taken by March 28.

The Skill events objective test needs to be taken by March 5 so we can let you know who will be moving onto the final round to do the production portion of the event at the state conference. This is the reverse order of how we do it at regional conference so please help us by having your students take the multiple choice test by the March 5 deadline. We will notify you by March 6 who is moving onto the final round.

<u>Skill Events include:</u> Computer Applications, Data Base Design and Applications, Spreadsheet Applications, and Word Processing.

Role Play Events Include: Help Desk, Banking and Financial Systems, Client Service (no test), Entrepreneurship, Hospitality and Event Management, International Business, Management Information Systems, Marketing, Network Design, Sports and Entertainment Management, Parli-Pro, and Introduction to Event Planning.

Pre-Submission Events

Just like regionals, some events have both a pre-submission component and a performance component. Pre-submission events MUST be sent in by March 5, 2025 or students cannot compete in that event and must be removed from the competition by March 6, 2025 when registration closes. Performance and Presentation Events

Students may do a total of two performance/presentation events at State Leadership Conference (SLC). It does not matter if they are individual or team events. Just make sure students are staying within their individual total of five events and that you are within your chapter limits for the events. Also, remember the limits are based on the number of students you sign up for the conference NOT the number of students that are on your national membership.

Arizona Only Events (Non-Qualifying for NLC)

Students can also participate in our Arizona Only Events. These events do not count as part of the student's event limit and include the following events only:

Battle of the Chapters, Business Graphics, Chapter Scrapbook: Traditional, Electronic Chapter Scrapbook, Chapter Awards Program (AZ Bronze, AZ Silver, AZ Gold, and AZ Platiumn), Chapter T-Shirt (Electronic Submission), State Trading Pin Competition, National T-Shirt Design, and Chapter Sign.

Competition Differences

Regionals

Objective Tests taken at competition.

Skill Event Production test (tasks) done as a pre-submit. Test taken at competition.

Photo Editing pre-submit.

Pre-submits due before registration closes so you have a chance to change events for students in case they didn't presubmit.

State

Objective tests taken at school ahead of time.

Skill Event Production test (tasks) done at the competition. Only top % of test takers move on. Test must be taken at home site prior to competition.

Photo Editing done at competition. Must bring own device.

Some new events added that weren't at regionals

Nationals

Objective Tests taken at competition.

Skill Event Production test (tasks) done at competition

Test determines who performs for role plays. Only top 15 test takers move on.

No Arizona only events offered only national qualifying events.

Outstanding Invoices:

State Officer Applications

Do you have a student who has great time management, is very organized, creative, hard working, motivated, dedicated, responsible, a leadrer, and a team player? If so we have the opportunity for them in possibly being an FBLA State Officer.

Applications are open until February 10, 2025. If the student makes it through the initial screening then they will be asked to come to an interview, complete an FBLA knowledge test, and even prepare a power point presentation. Interviews will be held in-person near ADE on February 24, 2025. Applicants will get that information if they are moving onto the next stage. After that the top 14 applicants or top 10% depending on how many total applicants apply will move onto the campaign stage at this year's State Leadership Conference where the top 8 students will become next year's state officer team.

Applicants must have a 2.75 of higher nown-weighted GPA, be in a CTE program that falls under FBLA or a program completer, be in good standing and an active FBLA member, complete the application form with adviser and admin. approval, and provide the required documentation asked for in the application. Tips from Regional Conference in Preparing for State

- Make sure everyone is in dress code. Some students were in jeans and short dresses and tennis shoes. Please make sure students abide by dress code always.
- Make sure your students bring photo ID to check into their events.
- Double check your registration to make sure your teams are correct. If you have more than one student or group who should be on a team please mark them as the same team number. If they are supposed to be on different teams, please make sure you change the team number so they are not the same number.
- Make sure your students do the pre-submission upload if they have a pre-submission event. Many students do not pre-submit in time for regionals.
- Make sure students read the guidelines, rubrics, and national topics for their events.
- Have students do quizlets, look over vocabulary, objectives, and competencies for event tests. There is lots of testing material out there if they take the time to look.
